Practitioner Services Records Scanning – Quality of Cross Border Records

Issues have been raised recently by GP practices in Scotland regarding the quality of records received from England and Wales. This was raised at our Records Scanning Project Board Meeting on 29th November.

We have investigated these concerns and have found when paper records are transferred to Scotland they are received scanned with up to six documents on one A4 sheet. The main issue is that these documents are mainly illegible therefore the GP practices are having extreme difficulty in construing the notes.

When Capture All receive these notes if there are only a few pages affected, these notes are stamped as follows:

POOR QUALITY ORIGINAL

If there is a significant amount of pages affected, they will insert the following sheet at the start of the file (they won't stamp individual sheets if this is the case):

THIS FILE CONTAINS POOR QUALITY ORIGINALS

Capture All Ltd - Scanning & Archiving

We would like to point out that these notes are received in this format and if GP practices were to receive paper notes the quality would be exactly the same. Currently Capture All attempt to enhance the notes by putting the sheets in colour and increasing the DPI to 300 however this is not enough to ensure a legible document in Docman.


The records Scanning Project Board have taken the following actions to highlight these concerns:

- Regional Managers will raise the issue at the next Cross Border Meeting and with Capita describing the poor quality of records being received from England and Wales.
- Our Senior Management will contact SGPC to raise awareness of the clinical risk of illegible documentation and will flag the issue with the Scottish Government.

In the meantime, if a GP practice receive notes that are illegible, it is advised that they contact the previous practice to see if they can provide a summary print out which can be scanned into Docman.

Sustainability Payment

The Scottish Government recently announced additional sustainability payments for practices through the most recent PCA(M)(2021)12. The payment total is £15m to be split among all practices according to their Scottish Workload Formula share allocation. The intention is for Practitioner Services to include this within your December payment.

As part of the requirement for the payment practices must complete the form within specifying what the additional money will help to support.

These forms should be returned to your contact at the Health Board. Should the form not be received by the 1st of March then regrettably the payment given will be removed from the March payment run as per the PCA.
