I refer to your freedom of information request that we received on 12 May 2022 requesting the following information.

Dear NSS, Advice in SHFN03-01 indicated The standard that should be applied when recruiting security staff is, BS7858 – 'The Code of Practice for Security Screening of Personnel Employed in a Security Environment', which sets out the vetting process to be followed.

BS7858 indicated SIA licensing vetting checks.

Can you clarify on the back of SHFN03-01;

- That hospital security staff should be PVG checked as they will have contact at work with vulnerable adults and children
- •that best practices for security staff working in NHS Scotland is to be SIA Licenced as outlined in BS7858
- can you confirm security staff must have adequate PPE

I can advise you that we have now completed the search of our records and can provide you with the following information:

National Services Scotland (NSS) Security staff do not work within areas or come into contact with vulnerable adults/children, therefore PVG is deemed not applicable. NSS Security is outsourced and all contractor staff working with NSS hold SIA licences. Where required all Security staff are provided or have access to appropriate PPE.

Under Section 17 of the Freedom of Information Scotland Act an organisation does not require to provide information if it does not hold that information. SHFN03-01 – BS7858 'The Code of Practice for Security Screening of Personnel Employed in a Security Environment' Is advice only e.g. not mandatory. We would recommend you contact each individual Health Board regarding their own practices as NHS National Services Scotland does not hold this information.
