## Freedom of Information Reference: FOI-2022-000053 – EDF and TotalEnergy Contracts

I refer to your freedom of information request that we received on 14 October 2021 requesting the following information.

## I am a GP in Easterhouse Health Centre Glasgow

I am concerned about the greatest health challenge ever facing our planet, the climate and nature crises.

I am weary working through the pandemic, dealing with Covid 19 problems much caused by political decisions and being asked to shoulder the responsibility for managing climate emergency created by those in power still relying on and procuring damaging fossil fuels.

I am concerned to see that you have extended the contract for EDF for another 18 months. https://www.publiccontractsscotland.gov.uk/Contracts/Contracts\_View.aspx?id=579361

I see that BT have switched to 100% renewable electricity... NHS Scotland must follow suit and switch away from the nuclear solution that EDF provides wherein we are reliant on non-renewable energy produced in England by French business in power stations controlled by China. I note EDFs main recorded achievements in carbon reduction were in getting staff to recycle and switch transport mode, This is very much tinkering at the edges, ...it.sounds familiar here, chimes with the response I got when asking for a renewable energy supplier for Lochend Surgery. I was told to switch of PCs and lights at night. Which of course I can and will do but you will be aware GPs are working long days with equipment switched on so that is , again, just tinkering at the edges. How can you possibly justify not using a renewable supplier when we are faced with such costly damage from climate change in so few years?

I was concerned to see that NHS scotland gas supplier Totalenergies have been extended until March 2022
