Important Information for NPCCD Medical

From 1st November 2023, NPCCD will be the primary source of Practice and GP data for CHI

- New CHI Testing has shown that some updates are not being made to NPCCD when the change happens – If a patient is registered to a GP/Practice not in NPCCD, the registration will not be allowed into New CHI until the GP/Practice is added to NPCCD then CHI
- Going forward, NPCCD Data MUST be updated as soon after any GP or Practice changes are approved by Health Boards
- The updates should be in line with any updates made to the GP IT systems if possible. There are some risks that registrations and payments may be impacted if NPCCD is not updated timeously.
