# 3. Service Update

# 3.1 Adult Service Update – Items to Note

, NHS Grampian) advised that Grampian were focused on planning for the funding bid and reducing waiting lists.

, NHS Highland) shared with the group that they had been unsuccessful in their attempts to employ another doctor but had advertised for a nurse and hoped to hold interviews in the coming weeks.



, the Sandyford Service, NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde) stated that the Adult and Young Person Services were still dealing with ongoing staff shortages and one of their psychiatrists has dropped one of their two weekly sessions causing a further shortage. The IPL Clinic was currently not in use due to lack of working machinery. They have approached the Manager of the Laser Clinic that sits under Plastic Surgery, but they were unable to help. The clinic has not been used since pre-pandemic and this is causing a large waiting list. Waiting times had increased for all areas of the service.

# 3.2 C&YP Service Update - Items to Note

, the Sandyford Service, NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde) advised there was now a Lead Psychologist for the service.

, NHS Greater Glasgow & Clyde) sought to reassure the group that the centre had been trying hard to recruit to the current vacancies. They were looking into advertising further and extending a fixed term colleague. It was also highlighted that the referrals to the YP service had doubled and were now almost in line with the adult service. A further operational group was likely to be formed with key GG&C representatives with the purpose to look at what they can do regarding waiting lists.

, NHS Lothian ( ) noted that there had been a significant increase in referrals to Chalmers and that they also had staff shortages which they hoped to rectify in the coming months. They had been allowed to recruit ahead of the anticipated funding. They hoped to hold further interviews later in the month.

# 4. GGC QI Project

#### Paper: NGICNS-SG-2022-09 shared her paper (NGICNS-SG-2022-09). It was based on QI information gathered last year which was focused on reducing waiting times in the adult service but they found there were some benefits to the YP services as well. After the presentation answered questions from the committee.

# 5.1 GRP progress

, NHS Lothian) summarised the progress for the group. Out of the six groups all bar one of them had met at least twice.

There were clear themes that crossed over from three of the groups regarding waiting times and how best to monitor patients that are already receiving treatment whilst on a waiting list. There will be a document circulated in the coming weeks.

This is in the finial stages and should be circulated to Health Boards in the coming weeks. Work is continuing at pace across different commitments as detailed in the December Framework.

# 9.1 Scottish Prison Service (SPS) Interview

Greater Glasgow & Clyde) informed the group that the meeting with SPS on the 3rd of May to help with the drafting a new policy for Trans people in custody. The SPS were still in the initial stages and will meet with other organisations. Once the initial finding have been drafted there will be an opportunity to input further.

# 9.4 LGBT Youth Scotland Life in Scotland report

, LGBT Youth Scotland) shared with the group the recent findings from the Life in Scotland LGBT Young People. The report covers many aspects of life such as hate crime, education, work life, etc. The research is carried out every five years and had started 15 years ago. Around 1,200 young people completed the survey. The findings

suggested that there have not been recent improvements for the LGBT community. The Transspecific information will be extracted and pulled together into a separate report. Data shared with the group included the response on four areas regarding the Health Service and how patients felt in terms of being 'respected and supported' in each area:

- A&E N/A
- Mental Health 74% five years ago vs 55% currently.
- Sexual Health Clinics 83% five years ago vs 73% currently.
- GP 76% five years ago vs 71% currently.

then went on to explain that in the report it highlighted that 81% of the Trans people surveyed have suffered with anxiety within the last year. Many felt forgotten about but said that once they were in the service and started seeing people and talking, it was a very positive experience.
