Error Code (E000853): Time-bar for Extensive Clinical Examination

Error code **(E000853)** will be updated as of 11 December 2025 to include more items of service that have time-bar restrictions in the SDR. This update will address the large number of claims received where item 1-(a) Extensive Clinical Examination is time-barred. This is one of the most common reasons for non-payments and subsequent adjustment forms (283 forms).

From 11 December 2025, any claim that fails the 11 complete calendar month time-bar for 1-(a) Extensive Clinical Examinations will be returned with error code **E000853** with the wording below.

This will allow you to review the details on your claim and re-submit a valid claim for payment. This will also reduce administrative time spent on the completion and submission of 283 adjustment forms for practices.

Please note that you may receive error E000853 for other items with a time-bar rule in the SDR. Please read the **full** error message carefully to identify the item of service time barred.

Please refer to the SDR for the exact wording of all time bars and details of the recall frequency for item 1-(a).

Reminder: Prior Approval Breaches

We have seen a substantial increase in the number of breaches of the NHS (GDS) Regulations in relation to Prior Approval, since the introduction of the new SDR in November 2023.

Practitioners should bear in mind that any variation to a course of treatment (resulting in either an increase or decrease in the value of the course of treatment) already approved, requires resubmission for *Prior Approval*, or it is a breach of the National Health Service (General Dental Services) (Scotland) Regulations 2010. Please note, the Regulations have not changed in this respect since 2010.

If the Regulations are not adhered to with regard to Prior Approval, and the treatment is undertaken, the practitioner may not be entitled to payment for that course of treatment.

Changes to Prior Approval claims

If treatment on an open Prior Approval claim changes, taking it below the prior approval limit for that claim (£600 for courses of treatment started between 1st November 2023 and 31st October 2025, and £660 for courses of treatment started on or after 1st November 2025), you will need to send the claim back to us with the box ticked indicating 'Prior Approval no longer required'. You can send this back to us by using the 'Request Advice' function within your practice management software. We can then close the claim and send it back to you. This is an administrative process that will allow you to submit the claim for final payment without errors.

Reminder: Observations on Claims

Unnecessary observations on claims take longer to be processed and can delay payment. Please note we do not require observations to be entered on a claim in the following circumstances:

- Patient Failed to Return (PFTR) if a patient fails to return to complete treatment, your practice management software (PMS) has a function to declare PFTR, and you should not additionally record any comments about PFTR in the observations.
 Note: completion date of a PFTR is the last missed/cancelled appointment date.
- **Continuation Cases** please contact your PMS if you are unsure how to process these claims and this should avoid any need for observations. For guidance on continuation cases, please see the article on our **website**.

Observations should also not be used for any of the following comments that are already within your claim detail. For example, patient is under 26 years old, patient in continuing care, patient is pregnant, SIMD area code, x-rays available.

Dental Pay Award Update

The 4% pay increase backdated to April 2025, as detailed in <u>PCA (D)(2025)3</u> issued on 25 August 2025, has now been processed. This adjustment will be reflected in the November Paid December 2025 Schedule.
